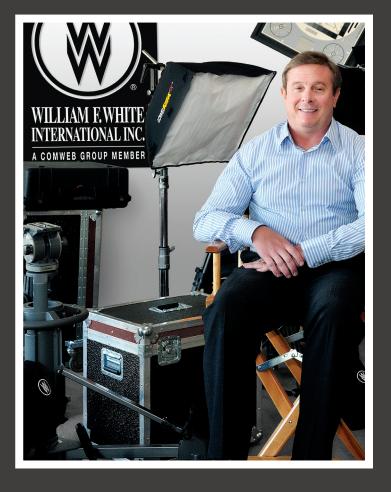

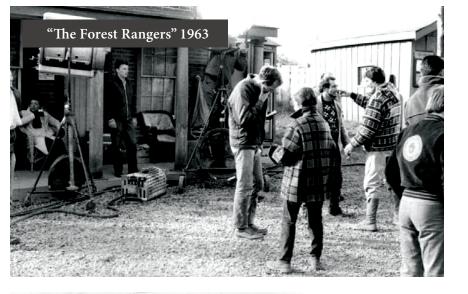

"The Forest Rangers" 1963 On set with one of the first productions ever supplied by WFW.

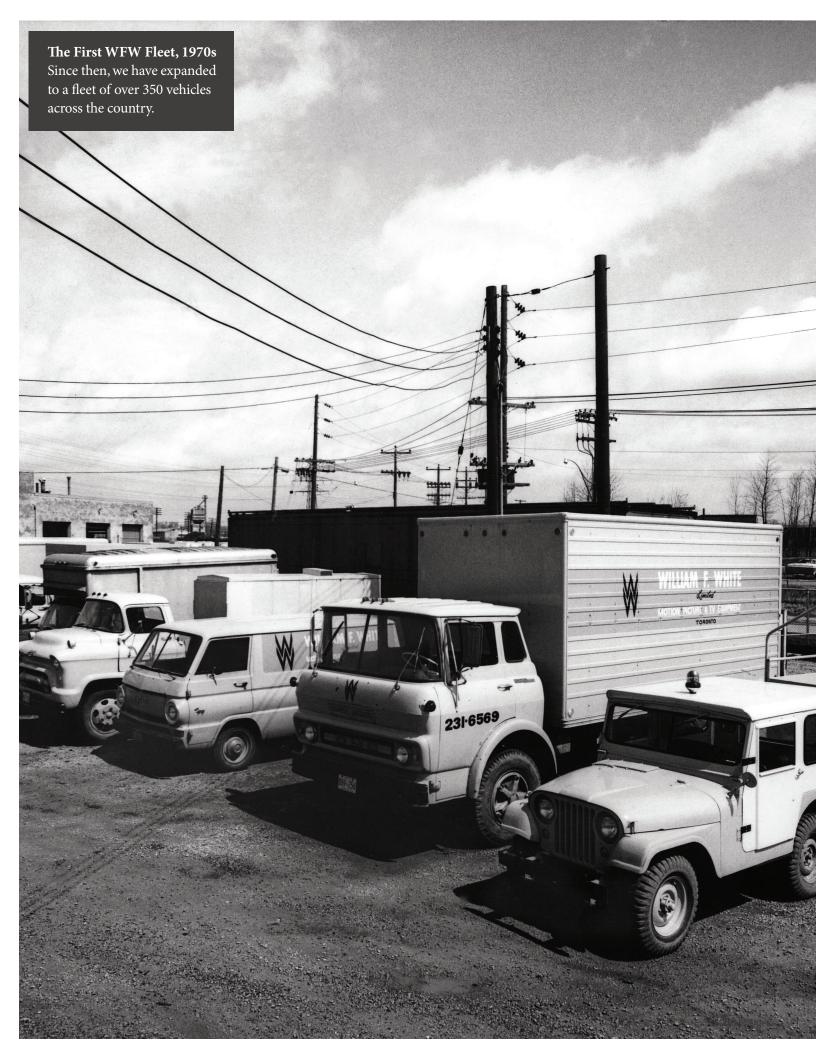
The Early Days One of the oldest WFW camera cars.

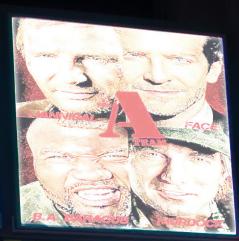
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50 years on set with Whites

WFW travelled to Jamaica, for the harrowing tale of the 1988 film "Passion and Paradise". The crew and equipment arrived shortly after a hurricane had struck the area. Our equipment technician at the time, Mike Harwood, recalls that the crew not only set up WFW generators for production equipment, they also worked to restore power and plumbing to the surrounding areas. Mr. Harwood is now the WFW National Director of Technical Support and Development.



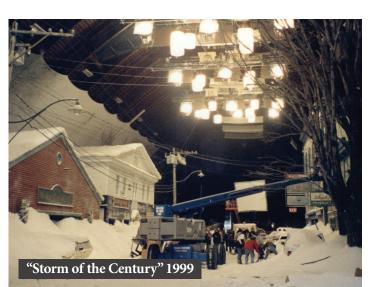
WFW participated in the \$200 million blockbuster "Titanic" in 1997, aboard a Russian research vessel off the coast of Halifax. The shoot used over 100 lights, ranging from 100W to 18K. To match the set, all WFW lighting was painted white! One of these lights could never be fully cleaned and is now nicknamed the "Titanic 5k".



One of the first productions WFW supported was the iconic 1963 Canadian TV series "The Forest Rangers," starring actor, Gordon Pinsent.



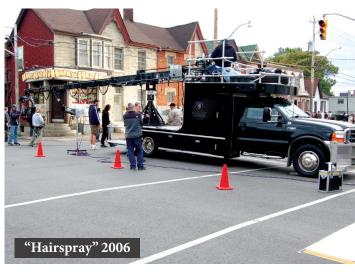
